## Pioneering Care, Research, and Sustainability in IBD: A Conversation with Dr. Marjolijn Duijvestein

### Dr. Marjolijn Duijvestein,

gastroenterologist and Head of GI Clinical Research at Radboud UMC in Nijmegen, is redefining how we approach inflammatory bowel disease (IBD)—through innovation, sustainability, and patient-centered care.

### From Surgery to Gastroenterology

Initially drawn to surgery during medical school, Dr. Duijvestein discovered her passion for gastroenterology with the encouragement of mentors and went on to complete a PhD on stem cell therapy for IBD. That foundation continues to shape her combined clinical and research focus today.

### Greener Medicine

Sustainability is central to her work. Hospitalizations and patient travel account for most of IBD's carbon footprint. Her advice: treat effectively to prevent admissions, reduce travel with teleconsults and same-day diagnostics, and embrace alternatives like **intestinal ultrasound** (IUS), which is both less invasive and environmentally friendly.

### Smarter Monitoring

Dr. Duijvestein is also leading innovations in digital health. A smart toilet seat pilot tracked disease activity passively, while a smart pill and wearables show promise in predicting or detecting flares before symptoms appear.

### Clinical Trials and the Road Ahead

Trials remain essential but challenging, particularly with placebo arms and repeat endoscopies. Patient education helps overcome barriers—reminding participants that today's treatments exist thanks to earlier research volunteers. She also calls on sponsors to provide clear training materials on drug mechanisms of action.

Her outlook is hopeful: from appendectomy studies to combination therapies and epigenome-based drug matching, the future of IBD care lies in balanced, holistic approaches.

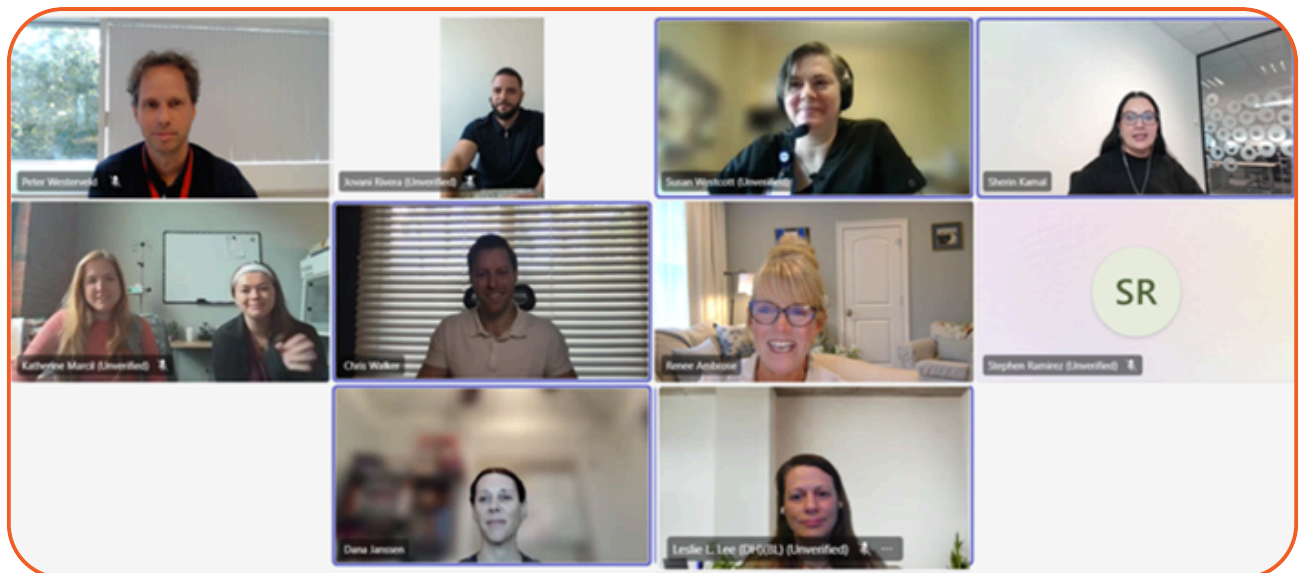
## Shaping the Future: Study Coordinator Focus Group
